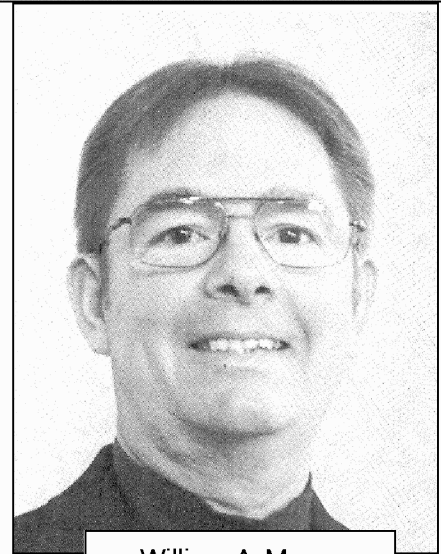
PipeLineNews.org was founded in 1999 and functions as a "boutique" news service, providing vital information regarding national security matters, including the culture war, the rise of radical Islam and the "stealth jihad."

Organizationally, PipeLineNews describes itself as a purpose-driven group of investigative journalists and researchers with extensive experience whose mission is to bring to the public's attention information that, because of the constraints under which the mainstream press operates, is not generally and widely available.

PipeLineNews (PLN) has a large and influential readership and has been featured in national and local media. Information developed by PLN has been presented in Congressional testimony, widely disseminated within public and private organizations and has been used by law enforcement agencies.

In 2008 PipeLineNews.org was involved in disclosures regarding Senator Barack Obama's Muslim outreach director, Mazen Asbahi, detailing his ties to Islamist organizations, which resulted in his abrupt resignation from the campaign on August 4.

In another example of PLN's work, Mayer noted that Senator Tom Coburn (R, Oklahoma) has been active in an ongoing effort to halt actions taken by the

State Department which enable and fund some of America's key Islamist organizations (in this case the Islamic Society of North America, ISNA).

PipeLineNews.org has also been deeply involved and has been recognized for its work to stop a program—promulgated by cabinet level bureaucracies—designed to censor government communications so that terms such as "jihad," "radical Islam" and "Islamic terrorists" are not used. Information PLN provided helped turn the tide in this matter, resulting Congressman Pete Hoekstra's (R, Michigan) successful effort to stop the process.

Mr. Mayer's talk will be titled "The Stealth Jihad and You."

“Republicans: The Party of Ideas” ...President Richard Anderson

Last month I wrote of measures taken to strengthen the membership of our club. These measures were fine-tuning in nature thanks to Tom Fryer’s bold and visionary leadership in establishing a firm foundation for political action. Your current leadership thus inherited an organization that is operationally solid, needing only tweaking as the political landscape changes. With this strong mechanism in place, we can now look ahead to what must be done.

The challenges Republicans face in the months ahead require that our message be clear, concise and on-target. Too much has been written about us as *The Party of NO*, that we stand like know-nothings astride the path to progress charted by Barack Obama, Nancy Pelosi and Harry Reid. As the conventional wisdom has it, if only the Republicans would quit stalling, and thwarting the will of the enlightened Left, the American people could be rescued from the devastation wrought by George W. Bush.

Liberals---who make up a majority of the Democratic Party---and conservatives---who make up a majority of the Republican Party---are different, at least with respect to their political viewpoints. Quite different. At the risk of oversimplifying, the disagreements between Democrats and Republicans stem from three inescapable realities:

1. The inherent conflict between the creative destruction involved in free-market capitalism and the innate human propensity to avoid risk and change.
2. The ever-increasing international competition.
3. The growing disparity in behavioral norms and social conditions between upper and lower income Americans.

In addressing these realities, we must balance the economic dynamism and growth of free markets against the unity and stability of our society. In short, how do we encourage economic growth while ensuring social cohesion, and a decent and just society?

As we Republicans approach the campaigns of the next two years, therefore, we should have some understanding of how our conservative beliefs differ from those of our friends on the Left. Moreover, in order to enable us to conduct meaningful dialog with Rossmoor independent voters, we must be able to say with clarity that unfettered free markets are unacceptably destructive when steps are not

taken to protect those unable to cope. No social compact can be successful if there is a permanent underclass, or if it is composed simply of the haves and have-nots.

Republicans understand this. We know that free markets must be restrained by monitoring and some regulation, and that the vulnerable amongst us must be helped to enjoy the benefits of living in a free land, no matter what or whose bad choices led to their disadvantage. Republicans have a vision of the future that ensures the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness for all Americans.

On the other hand, the dead hand of over-regulation and deficits will have the effect of stifling growth, burdening the future, and severely limiting the creation of jobs for our grandchildren and their children.

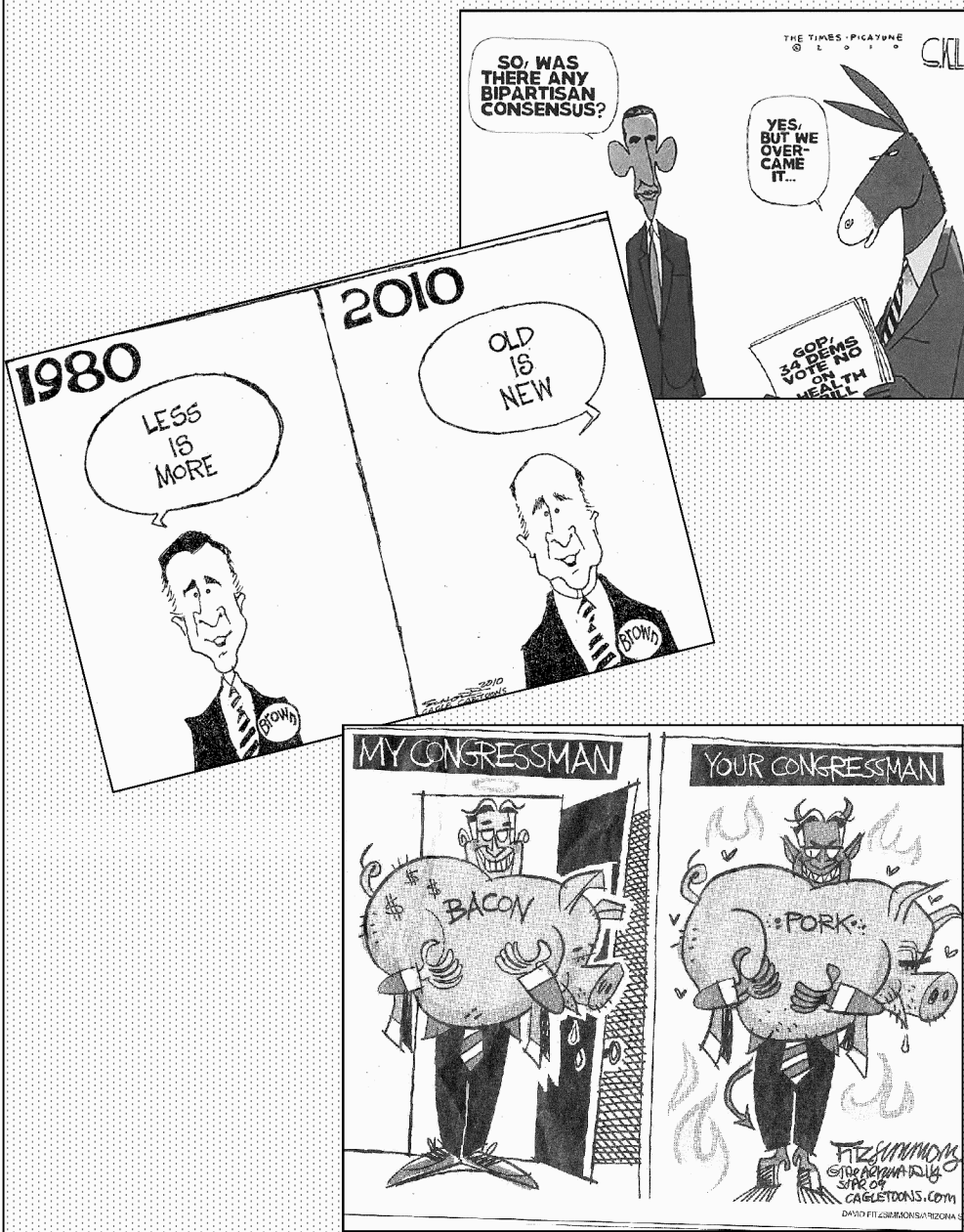
Let us begin by telling our friends and neighbors that when White House advisor David Axelrod said on ABC’s “This Week” on Sunday March 14th that the president is “just trying to give the rest of America the same opportunities (in healthcare) that the people of Massachusetts have,” it should have been a wake-up call. The good people of that state are so enamored of their universal healthcare that they sent Scott Brown to Washington to tell Obama to stop trying to impose this expensive foolishness on the rest of the country.

For example, Massachusetts spending on healthcare has risen faster than the already-high national average for seven of the last eight years. The state’s insurance premiums, already the highest in the nation, have seen costs rise 7 to 12 percent this year, despite the market’s domination by non-profit insurers, thus raising insurance costs each year 21 to 45 percent faster than the national average. Welcome to the Democrat’s vision of the future for all Americans.

Over the next few months the club’s Issues Committee, under the leadership of Jack Case, will be identifying matters of great importance facing our nation, and offering talking-points we can use to convince Rossmoor Independents that, among other things, our party has compassionate, fiscally prudent ideas for dealing with healthcare, and the appalling deficits that so heavily mortgage our children’s future.

Republicans are once again the party of ideas, good ones, and we are proud to raise our voices in support.
